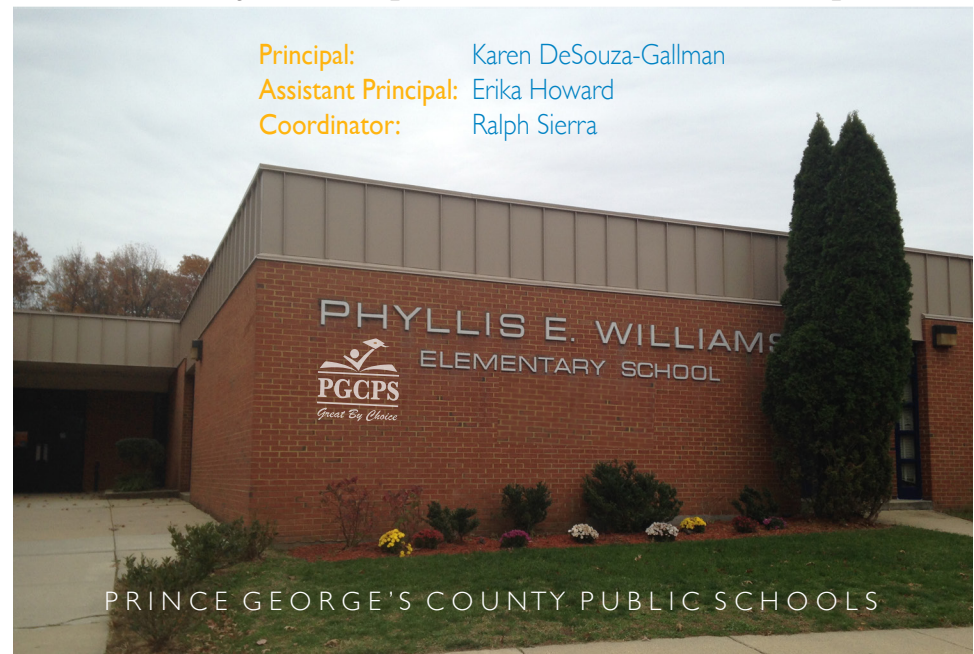

A Spanish Immersion School:

Spanish Immersion is an educational approach in which students are taught the curriculum content through the medium of a second language, Spanish.

Children learn their entire core subjects (reading, writing, mathematics, social studies, and science) in Spanish. Spanish speaking teachers immerse students 100% in the target language as they learn the Prince George's County Public Schools curriculum.

In this way, immersion students not only learn the content, but also gain knowledge of the language in which it is taught.

Note: Admission is limited to students entering Kindergarten. Students must be 5 years of age by September 1 to enter Kindergarten. Spanish Full Immersion model is a replica of our successful French Full Immersion program.
