# **2017 Summer Programs**

## **Prince George's County Public Schools**

### **General Information**

#### **Introduction**

Prince George's County Public Schools (PGCPS) Summer Programs offer students opportunities for acceleration, enrichment, credit recovery, or original credit. This 2017 Summer Programs Guide should be used to review the available options and learn how to apply. Program availability will depend on enrollment. Space is limited – apply early!

For more details, please consult with your school counselor or contact the Summer Programs Office at 301-808-1124.

#### **Registration**

For credit recovery, students must obtain a registration form from the counselor at the base school. For some enrichment programs, the registration form will be available to download at [www1.pgcps.org/summerschool/](http://www1.pgcps.org/summerschool/). Dates, times, and registration are listed in this guide under the individual summer program. Additional records may be required depending on the program.

#### **Locations**

#### **Tuition Waivers**

Tuition waiver forms are available for credit recovery programs. Tuition may be waived by 25 percent or less of the full price of one course per student for students who are enrolled in the free or reduced meals program only. Completed waiver forms, signed by the base school principal must be submitted at the time of registration. Only PGCPS students are eligible for tuition waivers.

#### **Refunds**

Refunds are granted to students who must withdraw during the first week of school. Requests for refunds must be submitted on the appropriate form with the original receipt to the summer school site where the student was registered to attend.

#### **Attendance**

Students having more than two (2) absences or six (6) tardies will be withdrawn and will not be eligible for credit, grade, or refund.

## **Student Rights and Responsibilities**

Students must adhere to the Student Rights and Responsibilities Handbook. Please refer to Administrative Procedure 10101 at [www1.pgcps.org/administrativeprocedures/](http://www1.pgcps.org/administrativeprocedures/).

### **Dress Code**

Students must dress in a clean, neat, and safe manner. Uniforms are not required.

### **Progress Reports**

SchoolMAX is not available during the summer for progress reports. Please email the teacher to request a progress update for credit recovery and original credit programs. There are no grades for enrichment and bridge programs.

### **Final Grades**

Grades for credit recovery and original credit programs will be posted to SchoolMAX one week after the summer program is completed. There are no grades for enrichment and bridge programs.

### **Summer Curriculum**

Program curriculum is developed by content-area staff and aligned with content standards.

### **Forms of Payment for Summer Programs**

All programs accept money orders. Many accept Visa, MasterCard, or Discover card through the MySchoolBucks online payment application. Payment may not be made by check.

### **Students not Enrolled in a Prince George's County Public School**

Students outside of PGCPS are eligible to enroll in credit recovery and original credit programs only. At registration, these students must submit a transcript and a letter from their school stating the credit course taken during the summer is equivalent to the credit course that is needed.

### **Program Definitions**

**Bridge** programs prepare students with the academic skills to successfully transition between grade levels or school types.

**Enrichment** programs provide students with an extended learning experience.

**Original Credit** programs offer credits that count toward fulfilling requirements for graduation.

**Credit Recovery** allows middle and high school students the opportunity to earn previously attempted credits to meet promotion or graduation requirements.

## **Early Childhood: Jump Start to School Readiness**

<b>Program Description</b>	The Early Childhood: Jump Start to School Readiness is for children ages 4 and 5 who will be entering prekindergarten and kindergarten for the 2017-2018 school year. The students that are eligible to participate in this summer transitioning program need to be enrolled to attend school at Carmody Hills and Samuel Chase elementary schools. The summer program is designed to give students exposure to daily instructional experiences that will support the student's transition into prekindergarten and kindergarten in the fall.
<b>Who Should Apply</b>	Early Childhood students attending Carmody Hills and Samuel Chase elementary schools.
<b>How to Apply</b>	Early Childhood teachers at Carmody Hills and Samuel Chase elementary schools will provide recommendations for participation in the program based on criteria of needs derived from report cards and teacher recommendation.

## **Prekindergarten/Early Start School Readiness**

<b>Program Description</b>	The Early Childhood Office will offer a four-week program for Prekindergarten/Early Start students who were enrolled in Prekindergarten/Early Start during the 2016-17 school year. The summer program aims to provide high-quality academic learning opportunities to children working to master essential skills in language, literacy, math and social emotional development in order to demonstrate school readiness upon entry to kindergarten.
<b>Who should apply</b>	Prekindergarten/Early Start students who are currently enrolled and have not demonstrated school readiness skills based on classroom assessments and teacher referrals.
<b>How to apply</b>	Students will receive invitations from the Early Childhood Office via their classroom teachers.

<b>Who Should Apply</b>	<p>Reading: This program is designed for current 7th and 8th graders who are reading below grade level as determined by their end-of-year Scholastic Reading Inventory (SRI), R/ELA grades, and/or failing R/ELA grade.</p> <p>Mathematics: This program is designed for current 7th and 8th graders who are struggling with specific mathematics concepts. Eligibility will be determined by mathematics assessment data, grades, and/or failing math grade.</p> <p>Professional School Counselors will notify parents of students who are selected for the summer school program.</p>

## **Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM) Program**

<b>Program Description</b>	The Middle School Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM) Program is for selected students entering Oxon Hill Middle School and Thomas Johnson Middle School to assist them with the transition from elementary to middle school. Through the use of hands-on, minds-on STEM activities, students will be supported as they develop skills and processes that will prepare them for success in middle school and beyond.

## **Science and Technology Bridge – First Steps to Success**

<b>Program Description</b>	The First Steps to Success Program is designed to assist incoming Science and Technology students at Charles Herbert Flowers High School and Oxon Hill High School with the transition from middle to high school. Students will integrate content knowledge and skills necessary for success in high school, college, and career as they participate in minds-on, hands-on activities in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics. Students will develop skill sets in collaboration and problem solving by working together to complete a group project. Students will also make authentic STEM connections to college and career by attending a research institution.

## **Academic Validation: High School Assessment**

<b>Program Description</b>	The Bridge Plan for Academic Validation is an optional program available for students who are having difficulty passing the Biology and Government High School Assessments (HSAs). The program has been developed by the Maryland State Board of Education and will be administered by Prince George's County Public Schools. Students will have an opportunity to complete one or more Biology and Government projects during the four-day summer program. Students must be rising seniors or potential August 2017 graduates.
<b>Who Should Apply</b>	In order to be eligible for the program, students must meet the following criteria: <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• currently enrolled in and passing all classes needed for graduation;</li><li>• attending school regularly according to the attendance policy;</li><li>• have completed all other graduation requirements;</li><li>• be classified as a rising senior in high school; and</li><li>• be a potential August 2017 graduate only in need of one or two projects to complete graduation requirements.</li></ul>

## **Blended Learning Online Credit Recovery**

<b>Program Description</b>	Blended Learning programs provide amazing flexibility in allowing students to continue their education by accessing coursework conducive to their individual schedules in an online and flexible classroom environment. It is important to note, however, that these courses follow an accelerated schedule, weekly assignment deadlines, regular participation, and can be more rigorous than an actual high school classroom. It is imperative to remain self-motivated, disciplined, and consistent within your registered course to ensure that your assignments and requirements are completed on time. However, dedicated students can complete their coursework at an accelerated course if determined and hardworking.
<b>Who Should Apply</b>	Students currently enrolled in grades 9 – 12 interested in repeating credit in high school courses through a blended learning online course meeting at home schools or nearby.
<b>How to Apply</b>	With the assistance of the Professional School Counselor, eligible students must submit a completed Student Registration and Grade Report Form and money order at the time of registration. Registration will occur June 1, 2017 - June 29, 2017 at each high school. Prince George's County Public School students eligible to graduate at the end of summer 2017 must also present a Certification of Graduation Form along with their official transcript at the time of registration.

## **College Preparation Boot Camp**

<b>Program Description</b>	The College Preparation Boot Camp is designed for rising seniors and juniors. This boot camp will provide students with a robust opportunity to engage in college exploratory activities such as completing a sample college application, writing a college entrance and scholarship essay, learning about the college entrance process through SAT and ACT preparation, and identifying sources to pay for college.
<b>Who Should Apply</b>	Rising Prince George's County Public School seniors and juniors who want to gain a better understanding of the steps in the college entrance process.

## Credit Recovery and Original Credit High School

**Program Description** The Credit Recovery and Original Credit program provides an opportunity for currently enrolled high school students to take courses in traditional classroom settings during the day and/or in the evening for original credit (enrolled in course for the first time); repeat credit (course repeated); and non-credit (for review or enrichment). Graduation at the end of the program is available for eligible students.

ESOL students will attend Eleanor Roosevelt, Central, and High Point High Schools.

**Who Should Apply** Students currently enrolled in Grades 9 – 12 interested in original or repeat credit in high school courses through a traditional classroom program.

**How to Apply** With the assistance of the Professional School Counselor, eligible students must complete a Student Registration and Grade Report Form and pay by credit card (MasterCard, Visa, or Discover) or money order at the time of registration (see dates below).

Prince George's County Public School students eligible to graduate at the end of summer 2017 must also present a Certification of Graduation Form along with an official transcript, High School Assessment scores, and Student Service-Learning hours at the time of registration.

Failure to register will result in ineligibility to participate in the summer graduation ceremony and receive a PGCPs high school diploma.
