## Title I Intensive Intervention Summer School (IISS)

<b>Description of Program:</b>	<p>The Title I Intensive Intervention Summer School (IISS) is a coordinated, systematic effort to improve the literacy and mathematical skills of students in the Title 1 elementary and middle schools. IISS strives to: (1) Provide instructional support to students who are currently achieving significantly below grade level. (2) Provide specific instruction to improve reading comprehension through proven teaching techniques. (3) Provide research proven mathematics support.</p> <p>The Intensive Intervention Summer School program will serve approximately 1800 students in 10 elementary school sites and 1 middle school site from the 53 Title I schools. Based on academic needs, students will receive 240 minutes per day of small class instruction (15:1 students/teacher ratio) in either reading/language arts or mathematics and 60 minutes per day of structured activities in wellness, physical fitness, and nutrition education.</p>

## HIGH SCHOOL ASSESSMENT

**Description of Program:**

The HSA Academic Validation Program is an MSDE initiative for students who have not passed one or more HSA and meet the PGCPs Bridge Plan criteria. The program provides an alternative way for students to demonstrate their understanding of the core concepts from the HSA courses.
